FROM FATHER MICHAEL

Bring flowers of the rarest.....

Our Lady's month of May, arguably the most beautiful month of the year, is a time to celebrate that it is only by Mary's obedience, faithful discipleship and loving care that our world has been redeemed. It was her "Yes" to God at Nazareth that averts disaster and that sets our planet on a path towards renewal and sustainability. And it was her patient standing at the foot of the cross that inspires us to continue our journey to the green pastures of real peace and justice.

Meanwhile St Austell Community Hospital is opening a new abortion clinic, Carbis Bay Hotel is felling ancient woodland to make way for some more facilities for the G7 conference, and the people of India are creating their own funeral pyres to bury the Covid dead. How desperately sad and tragic all these things are! When are we going to learn? How Our Lady's tears must water the earth!

Last Sunday for the Office of Readings we read this very mysterious passage from Revelation 12, "When the dragon realised that he had been thrown down to the earth, he began to pursue the woman who had given birth to the boy. She was given the two wings of a large eagle in order to fly to her place in the desert, where she will be taken care of for three and a half years, safe from the serpent's attack. And then from his mouth the serpent poured out a flood of water after the woman, so that it would carry her away. But the earth helped the woman; it opened its mouth and swallowed the water that had come from the dragon's mouth." This is all very mysterious and apocalyptic but I do love that idea of the earth coming to the assistance of the woman; Mother Earth and the Mother of Jesus working in harmony an alliance that through the Cross and Resurrection will bring us to our Promised Land.

SAINT RICHARD REYNOLDS, MARTYR – 5TH MAY

Richard Reynolds is thought to have come from Pinhoe in Exeter, and was a Bridgettine monk of Syon Abbey. He suffered martyrdom with the Carthusians at Tyburn on May 4th 1535, for refusing to take the oath of royal supremacy under Henry VIII. He was known for his personal holiness, and was one of the forty martyrs canonised by Pope Paul VI in 1970. Syon Abbey, one of the great medieval monasteries, was dissolved in 1539 by Henry.
