

<p>MARCH</p> <p>Sat 28th</p> <p>Sun 29th</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Matthew 21:1-11; Isaiah 50:4-7; Philippians 2:6-11; Matthew 26:14-27:66</p> <p><i>Today is a profession of our faith, proclaiming that in going to his death, Jesus begins his returning in glory to the Father. Two gospels are read. In the first the crowds acclaim their King, in the second they reject him. In the light of the cross, Holy Week begins.</i></p> <p>5.15pm: Confessions 6.00pm: Mass (Int: The Parish)</p> <p>8.30am: Mass 10.30am: Mass (Int: Jean Fowles RIP) 3.00pm: Holy Hour – Stations of the Cross</p> <p style="text-align: right;">We celebrate this Lenten devotion alongside our brethren from St Pauls, Charlestown. Together, we journey with Jesus.</p>
<p>Mon 30th</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">MONDAY OF HOLY WEEK</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Isaiah 42:1-7; John 12:1-11</p> <p><i>The chief priests plot to kill Lazarus who had become a symbol of the life that Jesus was offering to all who follow him. And in an act of love, Mary anoints Jesus, symbolising his own impending death.</i></p>
<p>Tues 31st</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">TUESDAY OF HOLY WEEK</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Isaiah 49:1-6; John 13:21-38.</p> <p><i>Jesus is the Light of the Word, yet now the darkness gathers. But Jesus does not waver, does not turn away. He places his trust in his Father.</i></p> <p>7.00pm: Evening Service at St Paul’s Charlestown. A special joint service in the Celtic tradition with Taize chants.</p>
<p>APRIL</p> <p>Wed 1st</p>	<p style="text-align: center;">WEDNESDAY OF HOLY WEEK</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Isaiah 50:4-9; Matthew 26:14-25.</p> <p><i>Priests of the Diocese renew their vows and gather blessed oils which are then brought back to every Parish so that members of our community can be anointed at important moments in their lives. The Mass will be streamed live via YouTube.</i></p> <p>12noon: Chrism Mass at Plymouth Cathedral</p>

Thurs 2 nd	<p style="text-align: center;">MAUNDY THURSDAY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Exodus 12:1-8,11-14; 1 Corinthians 11:23-26; John 13:1-15.</p> <p><i>On this night we celebrate the 'source and summit' of our Faith – The Mass. Jesus asked us to do this in memory of him, and for over two thousand years we have done so. After Mass there will be 40 minutes of 'watching' (to symbolise the 40 days of Lent).</i></p> <p>8.00pm: Mass of the Lord's Supper. Followed by Watching and Night Prayer.</p>
Fri 3 rd	<p style="text-align: center;">GOOD FRIDAY</p> <p style="text-align: center;">Readings: Isaiah 52:13-53:12; Hebrews 4:14-16;5:7-9; John 18:1-19:42</p> <p><i>Jesus, a king despised and disfigured; a suffering servant for all creation. Good Friday gives full expression to the faith with which the Church looks on the lamb sacrificed. Our perfect high priest hangs high over the world. Come, let us adore.</i></p> <p>10.30am: Walk of witness & service beginning at Holy Trinity Piazza, St Austell. 12.30-1.30pm: Silent witness outside St Mary's C of E church, Biscovey.</p> <p>3.00pm: Celebration of the Lord's Passion.</p>
Sat 4 th	<p style="text-align: center;">HOLY SATURDAY</p> <p>10.00am: Swieconka (Blessing of the Baskets) 10.30am: Office of Readings and Morning Prayer</p> <p>8.00pm: The Easter Vigil. Followed by drinks to celebrate Easter.</p>

Our Christian lives would have no meaning if the Christ who died for us, has not also risen. During these three days we recall the historical events of the Last Supper, Crucifixion and Resurrection. And when we do this, we celebrate the mystery of our redemption in the presence of the risen Lord with us today and for all time. In Christ, we too have died and are risen, though our resurrection has not yet fully arrived.
