SYNOD MEETING IN ROME 4 - 29TH OCTOBER.

"A key event for the most ambitious Catholic renewal project in 60 years. Bishops, priests, Religious and laypeople will be asked to consider a series of questions as part of the global synod process, including the ordination of married men, greater acceptance of LGBTQ+ Catholics, a reform of governance, the selection of bishops and lay leadership.

An overhaul of the seminary system to ensure that clergy are trained in a synodal manner is also mentioned repeatedly. This reflects a concern that some priests, particularly those ordained in recent years, have resisted or ignored the synod process.

A section of the document is devoted to the "promotion of the baptismal dignity of women", a topic which emerged as an urgent priority during the initial synodal dialogues worldwide.

Pope Francis has ruled that, for the first time, women will take part in the October assembly as voting members. Participants will be asked to address "women's participation in governance, decision-making, mission and ministries at all levels of the Church" and how this can be supported through appropriate structures including "new ministries". (The Tablet 24th June 2023)

And all to be accomplished is a spirit of humility, toleration and discernment. What Pope Francis definitely does not want is to turn the Church into a mini House of Commons style debating chamber!
