I have always been a bit diffident about the idea of "obligation". Surely, if we truly love God and love the Mass we will want to be at Mass as often as possible. This is where we meet the Lord, share in the worship of all the saints and angels and receive the food of eternal life.

But there again maybe I have been a little naïve. Maybe, we weak human beings need that extra nudge of "obligation". Maybe our love needs a little extra encouragement. Maybe attending Mass on Holy Days of Obligation should be regarded as a kind of bare minimum of what it means to be a faithful Catholic.

During the Covid pandemic the holy obligation to attend Mass every Sunday and every high day and holy day was suspended, for fairly obvious reasons. Since the end of the Covid restrictions the Bishops of England and Wales have re-instated that obligation. Watching Mass on YouTube and Facebook does not fulfil that obligation. We need to be at Mass physically and in person just as Jesus and the Apostles gathered together in the Upper Room.

What we don't want to do though is to create another layer of Catholic guilt. If through no fault of your own you are unable to attend Mass do not feel guilty about it. Laziness is a sin, a wilful decision just to do our own thing is a sin, coming to Mass with hatred in our hearts is a sin, but having to go to work or care for a sick family member is not a sin.

And anyway there is always the sacrament of Confession!
