ST BENEDICT 480-547 - In the early church many men and women chose to leave behind the settled life of family and career in order to meet God in the desert. There wasn't much organisation behind this, just that fundamental calling to leave everything behind for the sake of the gospel. The genius of Benedict was to provide in his Rule a framework for bringing these sometimes very eccentric men and women together into one family. The three vows that form the basis of the rule are obedience, stability and conversion. In a recent book by Bishop Erik Varden, entitled "Entering the Twofold Mystery", the former Abbot of Mount St Bernard's Abbey in Leicestershire, interprets those three vows as learning to be free, establishing roots and constantly growing, something there I think for all of us.

SEASON OF CREATION 2022 – LISTEN TO THE VOICE OF CREATION

The season of Creation is an annual event to listen and respond to the cry of Creation. It is a time when the ecumenical family around the world unites to pray and protect our common home. The Season begins on 1st September, The World day of Prayer for the Care of Creation, and ends on 4th October, the Feast of St Francis of Assisi, the patron saint of ecology. This year the theme is "Listen to the Voice of Creation".
