**A NOTE FROM CARITAS - SUPPORT FOR PENSIONERS ON LOW INCOMES-** An estimated 880.000 low income pensioner households eligible for pension credit currently fail to claim it and a deadline is approaching. The government says it is worth an average of £3,900 a year, but it is also a gateway to other financial support such as winter fuel payments.
