RECEIVING HOLY COMMUNION

- The Bishops of England and Wales have now decreed that in the light of the reduced dangers of catching or transmitting the coronavirus Holy Communion on the tongue, either standing or kneeling, will now be allowed. If this is how you prefer to share in the Eucharist the Bishops ask you to approach the altar towards the end of Holy Communion as and when everybody else has finished. What is not yet permitted however is reception from the chalice.

FROM FATHER MICHAEL

I still don't know what difference the government's proposed relaxation of all Covid restrictions on the 19th July is really going to make to our life in the parish. Will we be able to sing together? Will we still be wearing masks? Will we still need to sanitize the church after each Mass? Will Catholics who have been away from Mass for more than a year now start coming back?
