TENTH ANNIVERSARY OF LAUDATO SI

“The work of the Church seeks not only to remind everyone of the duty to care for nature, but at the same time she must above all protect mankind from self-destruction.” Laudato Si’ 7

We know we face urgent challenges. “The impact of climate change will increasingly prejudice the lives and families of many persons. We will feel its effects in the areas of healthcare, sources of employment, access to resources, housing, forced migrations, etc.” Laudate Deum #2. Pope Francis’ encyclical Laudato Si’ is a prophetic call for us to rediscover our relationship with creation, God, and one another. This message is further deepened in Pope Francis’ Laudate Deum, which calls for urgent action to steward the earth’s resources for future generations.

As we continue to celebrate the Jubilee of Hope this year, we are inspired by the words of St. Paul to the Romans, that “...afflictions produce endurance, and endurance proven character, and proven character hope. And hope does not disappoint...” (Rom 5:5). Christian hope calls us to engage actively in the safeguarding of creation and healing the wounds of our world. This letter is an invitation to use the opportunity of Laudato Si Week to encourage people to reflect on the ecological challenges we are facing—not as reasons to despair but as an invitation to action and hope rooted in Christ.
